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## **Report on the Teaching Workshops**

*First workshop*, 8 November: organized together with fellows involved in ReSET program living in Cluj; invited Professor Magyari-Vincze; discussion topics: the cultural anthropology in Cluj: renewal proposal of Institute for Cultural Anthropology in Cluj; discussions on the formation of ReSET research teams and current courses and seminars.

Second workshop, 28 November: organized together with fellows involved in ReSET program living in Cluj and Professor Magyari-Vincze; participation: members of the Institute for Cultural Anthropology and MA students. Introduction of new members of Institute for Cultural Anthropology (among whom many are also ReSET fellows); arrange individual tasks and detailed issues for developing the anthropological institutionalization and debating in Cluj; proposals for developing teaching resources and facilities.

Third Workshop: Together with my team students in an informal place, and focused on organizing the research and fixing the tasks of each member of the team. Within the *Socio-economical Transformation in a Post-Communist Factory* research topic we established individual tasks regarding the fieldwork and commented the research reports each of team member had to write (for details see the **research report**).

Fourth Workshop: Together with Professor Eniko Magyari-Vincze, Professor Marius Lazar, and some ReSET fellows (Alina Branda, Reka Geambasu, Gyula Kozak, and Petruta Mindrut) in a formal place, and focused on developing critical thinking among junior students. We discussed about: the importance of critical thinking, strategies of implementing it and make it interesting for students, personal experiences regarding teaching and exercising critical thinking, the critical status of some teaching programs, teaching condition and teacher-student or student-student relationships.
